Campaigning & Awareness-Raising 2018

• 'Share the Journey', launched by Pope Francis and organised in the UK by Cafod, is a campaign which encourages groups to walk in solidarity with people fleeing war, persecution, natural disaster and poverty. The aim was to walk 24,900 miles - the distance around the globe. On June 17th 2018, parishioners from St Francis de Sales joined members of St Joseph's, St George's, St John's, St Cassian's and the Quakers in a local walk which added a combined 74 miles to the total. The walk included prayers and reflections focused on the experiences of migrants, including families walking from Venezuela to Colombia, from Myanmar to Bangladesh, from Syria to Lebanon and from Sudan to Uganda. There is still time to add your own miles! Pick up a card from the church porch. 'Mileage' to be presented to Theresa May in September.

Our fundraising supports Aid to the Church in Need (ACN), which works to alleviate the suffering of persecuted Christians around the world. In Syria, for example, 143 ACN projects were completed over the past 12 months, including supporting the Archbishop of Aleppo's 'Build to Stay' scheme encouraging Christians to remain in the city - such as Benjamin, who said "Christians like me want to stay in Syria, the land of our forefathers and the Cradle of Christianity". In Nigeria, violence against Christians has intensified in 2018, forcing large numbers of families to flee for their lives. It is reported that Boko Haram militants have left 15,000 orphans and 5,000 widows. ACN is supporting projects

providing food, counselling and education, and help for pastoral needs. Since 2009 the Diocese of Maiduguri has lost 200 churches, 25 schools, 3 hospitals and 3 convents. Please remember the faithful of Nigeria in your prayers. *Prayer cards available in the porch.*

Protests in Nigeria on 22 May against repeated killings of Christians. The previous week 19 people, including two priests, were killed during mass at St Ignatius Catholic Church, Ayar Mbalom, Benue state.

InterCare was set up by two UK doctors to support rural hospitals in Africa with donations of medicine and other medical equipment. The health units they support, in Ghana, Sierra Leone, Tanzania, Malawi and Zambia, serve 10 million

people who would otherwise have no access to the medical care we take for granted. Over the years we have sent them about £9000, including £860 in 2018. This funded the provision of 200,000 sterile gloves - an essential part of infection control. A further donation of £360 is to be made in August 2018. We are delighted to welcome a speaker from InterCare to the parish on 12 August.

Fair Close Centre, Newbury We have supported this centre for older people since 2013 and have sent them £2596, including £580 in 2018 which was used to upgrade their kitchen equipment. A further donation of £290 is to be made in August 2018. Thank you!

La Asunción Orphanage, Mexico City

Since 2005 we have sent £11,500 to this orphanage, helping them to meet lots of essential costs like healthcare for the girls and nuns, structural improvements to their buildings, education expenditure and urgent bills. In 2018 we sent £750. Mother María Guadalupe Reynoso Dueñas (Director of the Orphanage) wrote in 2017: "thank you for all the love and

generosity you have shown us over so many years. We firmly believe you are angels that God has put in our path to help our work supporting young girls. These girls have been forsaken, beaten and abused, but have not lost their innocence and purity of heart. It is only a few of us who are with the girls every day, but all who support us share the task of building happy and fulfilled lives. May God reward you for your generosity with health, peace and happiness for you and your families".



In 2018 we have sent ACN £580 to support Church in Need their work. They wrote to

us: "Through such

support [as yours] we can sustain the faith and hope of Christians who are in such need at this time. You are working miracles. Please know that you are remembered in Masses and prayers celebrating the hope of Christ we share. Thank you!"
